
E. Unfinished Business

The maker movement continues to grow in public libraries. Libraries are offering maker programming, building dedicated makerspaces with various equipment and tools, and increasing the amount of STEM and maker kits to check out.

Indian Prairie Library has offered maker-focused programs for all ages to inspire and empower people to make, create, and learn new skills. Maker-focused programs are helping new makers develop prototypes and business models and inspiring next-generation STEM leaders. During COVID-19 we continue to offer online maker style programming and they are well attended as patrons are interested in hands-on making.

We want to expand on our maker-focused programming and services by adding additional equipment for patrons to use in the library's exciting new maker space.

In October, we visited several libraries with makerspaces, and all had a variety of equipment including laser cutters and multiple 3D printers, both of which are very popular with their patrons. We do not have a laser cutter and our 3D printer is almost 7 years old (donated by the Foundation) and does not have the latest advances. Our 3D printer has always been used on a regular basis, even during COVID. There are several other pieces of equipment that we should add to the makerspace and we'll be working within our operating budget to purchase those items. These items are beyond the library's operating budget.

- Laser Cutter - \$17,000
- 3D printer (Ultimaker S5 Pro Bundle) - \$10,700

- A stocked **Library** of educational resources on a variety of maker-related subjects, so laser cutting, electric wiring, and 3D printing, is a must.
- **Laser Cutter.** Lasers can be incredibly helpful, whether engraving a design on metal, intricate wood cuts, or adding a final flourish to a project.
- **3D Printer.** 3D printing allows makers to create prototypes in a matter of hours, or for otherwise difficult to create parts and pieces of a project.
- A **Scanner** is a vital tool for digitally transferring sketches or outlines to a laser cutter printer, as well as for archiving sketches for future plans.
- **Sewing Machine.** Textile artists working on sewing-based projects such as clothing, embroidery, or patchwork would make use of a makerspace sewing machine.
- **Screen Printing Press.** Further expanding the utility of a makerspace for textile artists screen printing press allows makers to transfer designs onto fabrics and materials via
- **Video/Graphics Editing Software.** For makers like photographers or videographers, editing software will come in handy in a makerspace.

Of course, these essentials are simply suggestions. At the core of any makerspace mindset of creating something out of nothing and exploring your own interests. Create your makerspace with a supply of whatever media and tools you desire.

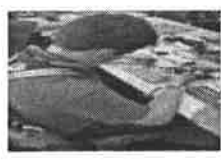
